Prepare to be amazed by the eccentric creativity of Nathan Dorrell, an international juggling champion and fulltime evangelist. His stage

name, the Crazy Tie Guy, comes from his wacky neckwear which is pure Dr. Seuss. But besides ministering with his wife Kathy by juggling the typical props, Nathan also preaches by juggling words and phrases. There is a technical term for his creations: "ambigrams." If you are not familiar with them, you just have to see one to understand. Here is an example.

This is an ambigram designed by *John Langdon. For several years now I have enjoyed the quirky designs in his book *Wordplay* along with Scott Kim's work in *Inversions*. Notice that the above phrase reads Art & Science. Now turn this page upside down. Do you see the word Philosophy? That is the magic of ambigrams. And there can be variations such as a word reading the same whether upsidedown or right-side up. Some must be viewed backwards (in a mirror) for the second word or phrase to appear.

This last style is Mr. Dorrell's specialty, prompting the title of his newest book,

Amazing Mirror Messages: Reflecting the Truth. And, indeed, his collection of 60 original creations is both amazing and delightful. Astonishingly, Nathan often combines two attributes into many of his ambigrams - they must be viewed both backwards AND upside-down. Clearly, Nathan is wired differently from the rest of the pack. Look at this ingenious design. It says 1Gate.

Now turn this page upside down and view it in a mirror or hold the page up to the light and view it from the back of the page. Clever, no? If you don't see the name Jesus, rotate the page and keep looking (Nathan offers this design imprinted on a clear plastic key chain that would make a great witnessing tool or inexpensive volunteer give-a-way).

Each of his designs also comes with a Bible-based starter script. Here's one of my favorites. It comes with a lesson about Jonah. Looking at it this way, it says RUN.



No need to turn this one over. Just check it out in a mirror. Do you see the



word TRUST? Eye magic! Nathan says, "Yes, presenting mirror messages can be much like presenting a magic trick." But that's the real question isn't it? How is it possible to get these ambigrams into a show? How do you take a backwards, upside-down, mirror thing and make it play for an audience? Take heart! Nathan has it all worked out. In fact he gives us a dozen different presentation ideas and tips ranging from the simple (overhead projector) to the reusable (paint the design on large plexiglass), to the close-up (pad of paper and a bleed-thru marker). My favorite technique is his jumbo stage presentation:

"Spray paint [the design] on a sheet or thin material so it penetrates to be read on the other side. I use two volunteers to hold the fabric as I paint. Then... all I have to do is grab the bottom of the cloth from behind and lift up as... my volunteers drop the cloth."

His book also gives us some ideas for holidays (Christmas, Easter, Mother's Day) and even a couple of Spanish ambigrams like this one:

Who is the "ORIGEN" of creation? John 1 give us the answer. . .(check it in a mirror), CRISTO! Bonus Bean Internet Resource



Many readers will be familiar with the cyber-space hangout for magicians called **The Magic Café**. But, in case you're in the dark, it is the #1 chat site for magicians and the allied arts. Its founder, Steve Brooks is both a Christian AND an FCM member. Currently there are also 37 staff members that help keep the site in order.

The site has over 25,000 registered members that have posted nearly 1,400,000 messages on over 100 different topic boards such as Grand Illusion, Close Up, Livestock, Escapes, Clowning, Vent, Ballooning, Product Review, and so much more. It's a GREAT resource with a fully searchable data base. The site is very easy to navigate.

There are two forums that should be of special interest to you. The first is a recent addition called The Fellowship of Christian Magicians. This forum "is for the discussion of topics involving the FCM. Posts may include questions about joining, club meetings, lectures, convention information and the like. Remember, FCM subject matter only." Some fun discussions are currently underway.

The second forum has been around much longer and is located under the **Special Interests** heading. It's called **The Good News** and is described as "Topics on the art of gospel magic." Mr. Brooks has indicated that he intends to move this forum next to the FCM forum at some point – which makes logical sense. Again, lots of great information is being traded on this forum. You don't have to be a registered member to access the site or read posts, but becoming a member is painless, free and allows you to join in on the discussions. You will not receive junk mail if you register. Plus, after 50 legitimate posts you will be granted access to protected areas of the site where secrets of the trade are discussed.

One word of warning – **The Magic Café** can be a bit of a rabbit hole. Once you tumble in you may have a hard time finding your way back out to the real world again. If you think you're ready, log on at <www.themagiccafe.com>. The Mad Hatter awaits you.
